Science at the DRFZ follows the concept of a "pathogenic" immunological memory, driving chronic inflammation in rheumatic diseases and being refractory to conventional therapies. By combining experimental biomedical and application-oriented clinical research, new therapies, selectively targeting this pathogenic memory, are developed.

The new Leibniz Graduate School for Rheumatology (LGRh) will offer complementary and interdisciplinary training by experimental and clinical scientists to educate next generation translational experts in rheumatology.
